


--Annual Meeting--

Our 58th Annual All Member Meeting is scheduled for 7pm on Thursday, 17 July 2025 at Mount Carmel Presbyterian Church, 3931 West Mt. Carmel Road.

Agenda will include:

- Report on water and broadband system performance
- \$2.2M ARPA grant project update
- Parcel 1 De-annexation from Meridian update
- Election of three directors.

The NLWA bylaws require that a quorum of at least 1% of the members participate in the annual meeting. Without a quorum, we cannot elect new directors or decide other business of the Association. A member in good standing is the owner of one or more properties with NLWA water service who is not overdue on any payments to the Association. Each member in good standing has one vote, regardless of how many served properties or meters they have. Such a member may vote in person at the annual meeting or may use our online proxy form (https://nlwa.ms/proxy) to designate another member in good standing to vote in his or her place at the annual meeting. If you are confident that the current Board of Directors is acting in your best interest, you may assign your proxy vote to the President of the Board, who will vote on your behalf at the annual meeting for the candidates and policies the Board is proposing. ANNUAL ALL-MEMBER MEETING Thursday, 18 July 2024, 7:00 p.m. MINUTES

At the appointed hour of 7 p.m. and the announced location of Mount Carmel Presbyterian Church, director and president Todd "Ike" Kiefer welcomed the members in attendance to NLWA's 57th annual all-member meeting and opened with prayer.

Before commencing the formal proceedings, the President presented to the assembled members a plaque commissioned by the board to honor their departed fellow director, Cindy Ross. Cindy lost her battle with cancer only a few months after being re-elected at the previous annual meeting. The plaque will be presented to her husband.

Fifteen members in good standing were checked against the rolls, signed in, and participated in person. Additionally, 49 validated members in good standing participated via president proxy and 3 via member proxy. Having calculated the quorum of 1% of the members on the voter roll of 3,319 being 34, and having determined that 67 members were participating, the president declared a quorum.

President presented the agenda for the meeting.

President introduced himself, board members, employees, engineer, and attorney.

The president presented proof of notification of the annual meeting and agenda in the form of water bills notes, Facebook posts, and IRIS automated alert calls, texts, and emails

Member Victor Threatt moved to dispense with the formal reading of the minutes from the 2023 meeting. Member William Morris seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

President delivered his annual report to the members on water and broadband operations and financial performance over the past year. Main points included:

- Net income of \$74,000 on gross revenue of \$2.7 million in the fiscal year ended 30 April 2023
- Faultless CY2023 drinking water quality / consumer confidence report
- MS Department of Health giving NLWA a bye this year after 9 consecutive annual perfect 5.0 management scores.

- Major project in work is a document audit and conversion to digital records. This is cause of many members being contacted to provide missing or updated documents.
- Ongoing line replacement capital project in leak-prone areas
- Association recently awarded a \$2 million ARPA grant to be used to improve water
 pressure for the Plant 4 service area comprising 1,573 served properties, over 4,000
 residents, 3 public schools, 3 churches, Briarwood Club, and the Van Zyverden plant.
 This is the last remaining low-pressure area in the system. It will be brought up to
 match the pressure of the rest of the system by installing a new, larger, and taller tank.
- North Lauderdale Wireless Internet, the Association's broadband system, remains selfsustaining and continues to serve more than 100 households.
- A draft copy of the annual audited financial report was made available to members at the meeting and has been posted online, with the final version to follow once received from the CPA.
- NLWA board continues to facilitate the de-annexation effort of Parcel 1, with 550
 petition signatures now collected. President enumerated the difference between the
 City's promised services and its actual services. Also explained that MS State Code has a
 provision for residents to form their own public improvement district and provide their
 own services, and that this path had passed muster in consultation with an attorney
 specializing in annexation matters.

There was no unfinished business.


The President opened the floor for member comments and new business.

The final agenda item was the election of one director. The board nominated member and interim director Lance Price for election to a three-year term. Lance introduced himself to the members. No more nominations were made. Member William Morris moved to close the floor to nominations. Member Victor Threatt seconded. Member Kevin Salvo moved to vote by acclamation. Member William Morris seconded. The nominee was elected by unanimous acclamation.

President adjourned the meeting at 8:10 p.m.





De-Annexation Parcel 1



- 1. NLWA was empowered by unanimous vote of our members at our 2022 annual meeting to assist the democratic process of de-annexing from the City of Meridian a 4.4 square mile portion of our certificated service area known as Parcel One that was annexed by the City in 2008.
- 2. There are many reasons for seeking de-annexation, but chief among these is the city levying a 32% increase in property taxes on our 563 member households and businesses in Parcel One for the past 16 years without investing a penny to install the sewerage, drainage, water lines, and hydrants promised in the Annexation ordinance and to the MS Supreme Court in the annexation hearings. The 1,700 people who live in Parcel One have paid more than \$11 million to the City of Meridian over this period. Parcel One tax payers may calculate the additional taxes imposed upon them by the City of Meridian using this Tax Calculator. This burden has only gotten worse with the recent 18% tax increase.
- 3. Crime has skyrocketed since annexation. The area was previously well-patroled by the Town of Marion PD and Lauderdale County Sheriff, but the city took jurisdiction and displaced them. At the same time, the city allowed the number of uniformed officers in the Meridian Police Department to drop from 99 in 2009 to approximately 40 today. Vehicle thefts and break-ins have become common. The two patrol cars that the City can staff in the evenings are rarely seen north of North Hills Blvd, which itself has become a high-crime zone. Meridian had 55 shooting victims and 14 murders in 2024; that's a shooting a week and murder a month. We would welcome a return of Marion PD and Lauderdale County Sheriff patrols in place of rarely seen Meridian PD patrols.
- 4. If your home address is on this Address List, your residence is within Parcel One and was annexed. Everyone in your household who is eligible to vote may sign this petition. We need 2/3rd of all eligible voters who reside in Parcel One to sign in order to proceed to legal action
 - 5. You may sign the master petition in person at the NLWA office, or you may print and complete ties Petition Form and deliver it by hand or mail it to our office. You may also photograph it and text it to 601-917-4766 or email it to parcel1@nlwa.ms. The PPIN number is for our acking purposes and you do not have to provide it. But we do need you to fill in your address, printed name(s), and signature(s).
- 6. Tis De-Annexation Fact Sheet de ails all the promises the City of Merdian has broken. We have already done considerable preparation to make our legal case. There is a legal path in state law for full de-annexation, as well as for us to form our own utility district governed by our own elected board to provide services we are not getting from Grey or county. In court, we can also fight for a refund of back taxes. Unless we make our case before a judge, Meridian will coast along for the next 16 years as it has the past 16 years, collecting our taxes to spend on its problems downtown without regard for its responsibilities up here.
